CHARACTERISTICS OF GEM

RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS, GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to be held on Thursday, 3rd September 2026 at 10:00 a.m. These include ordinary resolutions for the re-election of retiring Directors and the grant to the Directors of general mandates to issue and repurchase Shares.

2. RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with Bye-law 87 of the Bye-laws, Mr. Pierre Tsui Kwong Ming, a non-executive Director, and Dr. Cai Qing, an independent non-executive Director, will retire by rotation at the Annual General Meeting and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Details of the retiring Directors offering themselves for re-election, which are required to be disclosed by the GEM Listing Rules, are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

Process and Discussion of the Nomination Committee and the Board in Recommending the Re-election of the Retiring Directors

The nomination committee of the Company (the “**Nomination Committee**”) will recommend to the Board for the re-election of a Director (including an independent non-executive Director) in accordance with the following process:

- i. The Nomination Committee and/or the Board would review the overall contribution and service to the Company of the retiring Director and his/her level of participation and performance on the Board.
- ii. The Nomination Committee and/or the Board would also review and determine whether the retiring Director continues to meet the criteria as set out above. If an independent non-executive Director is subject to re-election, the Nomination Committee and/or the Board will also assess and consider whether the independent non-executive Director will continue to satisfy the independence requirements as set out in the GEM Listing Rules.
- iii. The Nomination Committee and/or the Board would then make recommendations to Shareholders in respect of the proposed re-election of Directors at the general meeting.

Based on the independence criteria as set out in Rule 5.09 of the GEM Listing Rules and the annual confirmation from Dr. Cai Qing, an independent non-executive Director, the Nomination Committee has assessed and considers that she is independent. In addition, the Nomination Committee has reviewed the overall contribution and service to the Company of each of the retiring Directors for the year ended 31st March 2026 as well as their participation at meetings of the Board or Board committees. Following discussion among members of the Nomination Committee, the Nomination Committee is satisfied with each of the retiring Directors’ level of participation and performance on the Board. Therefore, the Nomination Committee has recommended to the Board that the Retiring Directors shall be proposed to Shareholders for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Accordingly, having considered the recommendation of the Nomination Committee, the Board has proposed that all the retiring Directors, namely Mr. Pierre Tsui Kwong Ming and Dr. Cai Qing stand for re-election as Directors at the Annual General Meeting.

Further information about the Board’s composition and diversity as well as the Directors’ attendance record at the meetings of the Board and/or its committees and the general meetings is disclosed in the corporate governance report of the 2025/26 annual report of the Company.

3. GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 4th September 2025, ordinary resolutions were passed giving general mandates to the Directors to allot, issue and deal with unissued Shares (including any sale or transfer of treasury Shares out of treasury) and to repurchase Shares, subject to certain specified limits.

Under the GEM Listing Rules, the general unconditional mandates granted on 4th September 2025 will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting, unless renewed at the Annual General Meeting. The Directors believe that re-granting of the general mandates is in the interests of the Company and its Shareholders and accordingly, ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to (i) grant a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the total number of shares of the Company in issue (excluding any treasury Shares) at the date of passing of such resolution (the “**Issue Mandate**”); (ii) grant a general mandate to the Directors to repurchase fully-paid up Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the total number of shares of the Company in issue (excluding any treasury Shares) at the date of passing of such resolution (the “**Repurchase Mandate**”); and (iii) enable the Directors to issue (and sell or transfer of treasury Shares out of treasury), under the Issue Mandate, an additional number of Shares representing that number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate (the “**Extension Mandate**”).

Assuming no further Shares are issued or repurchased after the Latest Practicable Date and up to the date of the Annual General Meeting, if the Issue Mandate and Repurchase Mandate are granted by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting, the Directors will be given the authority to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares (or transfer out of treasury) up to a maximum of 90,901,862 Shares, and to repurchase fully-paid up Shares up to a maximum of 45,450,931 Shares, representing 20% and 10% of the total number of shares of the Company in issue (excluding any treasury Shares) respectively at the date of passing of such resolutions. The relevant resolutions to grant these mandates are set out as Resolutions Nos. 4 to 6 in the notice of Annual General Meeting.

The explanatory statement required by the GEM Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders in connection with the proposed Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular. It contains all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolution.

4. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that, to the best of their knowledge and belief, the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

5. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

A notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out on page 13 of this circular. At the Annual General Meeting, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to approve, inter alia, the re-election of retiring Directors; and the grant of the Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate.

A form of proxy for use at the Annual General Meeting is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you intend to attend the Annual General Meeting, you are requested to complete and return the form of proxy to the branch share registrar of the Company, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event no later than 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, 1st September 2026 or 48 hours before the time appointed for any adjourned meeting (as the case may be). Completion and delivery of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the Annual General Meeting or any adjournment thereof should you so desire.

6. VOTING AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

According to rule 17.47(4) of the GEM Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll, except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands.

So far as the Directors are aware and having made all reasonable enquiries, as at the Latest Practicable Date, no Shareholder is required to abstain from voting on any resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

7. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the grant of the Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate, the Extension Mandate and the re-election of retiring Directors are all in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend the Shareholders to vote in favour of all the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting as set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting.

Pierre Tsui Kwong Ming, Non-executive Director

Mr. Pierre Tsui Kwong Ming, aged 61, joined the Company in February 2015 as an independent non-executive Director. He was re-designated as an executive Director on 24th February 2016 and further re-designated as a non-executive Director on 9th February 2023. His appointment was continued for another three years commencing from 9th February 2026. Upon Mr. Tsui's re-designation as an executive Director, he was appointed as the Chief Financial Officer of the Group's hi-tech distribution and services division until his appointment as the Chief Executive Officer of this division on 9th October 2017, a role he held until 9th February 2023. During the period from 2006 to 2014, he was an executive director, the chief financial officer and company secretary of International Mining Machinery Holdings Limited, a company whose shares were listed on the Stock Exchange (Stock code: 1683) until 2012. He has comprehensive operating and financial experience in hi-tech distribution and services business. Mr. Tsui obtained his Master's degree in Accounting and Finance from the London School of Economics & Political Science, UK and a Master's degree in Business Administration from University of Southern California, the United States. He has been a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants since 1995 and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants since 1995.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, apart from the foregoing, Mr. Tsui does not have any interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO) in the Shares. He does not hold any other position with the Company or any of its subsidiaries nor did he hold any directorship on other listed public company in the last three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date. He does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company (within the meaning of the GEM Listing Rules).

Pursuant to the letter of appointment entered into between Mr. Tsui and the Company, the term of his appointment is for a term of three years and is subject to retirement and re-election at general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws. Under the said letter of appointment, Mr. Tsui is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$480,000 per annum which was determined by the Board on the basis of his level of responsibilities and by reference to his experience and market benchmark.

Cai Qing, Independent Non-executive Director

Dr. Cai Qing, aged 38, joined the Company as an independent non-executive Director in December 2021. Her appointment was continued for another three years commencing from 23rd December 2024. She is the chief executive officer of Hieroglyph Digital Technology Limited since November 2019, a professional company focusing on crypto and blockchain technology and application. Since June 2018, Dr. Cai has also been the research and strategy director of GOSS Institute of Research Management Limited, a research institute specializing in international studies, and applying Evidential Reasoning (ER) rule to stock trading and private equity investment. Dr. Cai is an editor of Crypto Review since September 2019, an e-journal providing views from both academic and practical perspectives on the development and application of blockchain technology and cryptocurrency. She has also been an executive director of Feng Zikai International Cultural Association since August 2018, a non-profit organization that promotes cultural exchange by organizing international cultural activities on Master Feng Zikai's art works and his humanistic thoughts. Dr. Cai has rich experience in digital marketing and news reporting in multiple media agencies and institutions including Hearst Magazine China, Xinhua News Agency Shanghai Branch, MAMMA MIA! China Project, Shanghai International Film Festivals Press Office, Jiefang Daily, etc. Dr. Cai has since January 2018 been a part-time lecturer of The University of Hong Kong where she was responsible for designing the syllabuses and teaching courses for Hong Kong Studies Program of The University of Hong Kong. From June 2016 to July 2017, she was the convener of "Internet + SHE": Innovation and Development 2017

Forum Series which initiated and co-organized two international forums in Shanghai and Beijing with Institute of Contemporary Social Service, Research Center on Smart City of Peking University, Information China, Shanghai Youth Daily Group and Shanghai Normal University. Dr. Cai completed a Bachelor's degree in Broadcasting, Television and Journalism from Shanghai International Studies University in 2010 and obtained an Intercultural Communication Training Certificate from Intercultural Communication Institute in Portland, Oregon in 2012. Dr. Cai later obtained a Master's degree in Intercultural Communication from Shanghai International Studies University since 2013 and a Doctor of Philosophy in China Studies from The University of Hong Kong since 2018. Dr. Cai is a member of the audit committee, remuneration committee and nomination committee of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, apart from the foregoing, Dr. Cai does not have any interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO) in the Shares. She does not hold any other position with the Company or any of its subsidiaries nor did she hold any directorship on other listed public company in the last three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date. She does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company (within the meaning of the GEM Listing Rules).

Pursuant to the letter of appointment entered into between Dr. Cai and the Company, the term of her appointment is for a term of three years and is subject to retirement and re-election at general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws. Under the said letter of appointment, Dr. Cai is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$480,000 per annum which was determined by the Board on the basis of her level of responsibilities and by reference to her experience and market benchmark.

Save as disclosed above, the Directors believe that there is no other matter concerning the above retiring Directors that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders nor is there any other information that needs to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of rule 17.50(2)(h) to (v) of the GEM Listing Rules.

The following is the Explanatory Statement required to be sent to Shareholders under the GEM Listing Rules relating to the repurchase of Shares on the Stock Exchange by a company whose primary listing is on the Stock Exchange. This Explanatory Statement contains all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHAREHOLDERS' APPROVAL

The GEM Listing Rules provide that all share repurchases on the Stock Exchange by a company with its primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of general mandate or by specific approval in relation to specific transactions.

Such authority may only continue in force during the period from the passing of the resolution until whichever is the earlier of: (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company, (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws, or any applicable law to be held, or (iii) the passing of an ordinary resolution by the Shareholders in general meeting revoking or varying such mandate.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total issued share capital of the Company comprised 454,509,311 Shares of HK\$0.10 each.

Subject to the passing of Resolution No. 5 set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 45,450,931 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company, during the period prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares on the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets value of the Company and its assets and/or its earnings per Share, and shares repurchased and held as treasury shares may be resold on the market at market prices to raise funds, or be transferred or used for other purposes, subject to compliance with the GEM Listing Rules, the Bye-laws and the applicable laws and regulations of Bermuda. Repurchases will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Bye-laws and the applicable laws and regulations of Bermuda. The Company may not repurchase its own Shares on GEM for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange from time to time.

There might be an adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the financial position disclosed in its most recent audited financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2026) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. UNDERTAKING

The Directors will exercise the power of the Company to repurchase Shares in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules and the applicable laws and regulations of Bermuda. Neither the Explanatory Statement nor the proposed share repurchase has any unusual features.

7. DIRECTORS, THEIR CLOSE ASSOCIATES AND CORE CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective close associates (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) has any present intention to sell Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any core connected persons (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

8. TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interests, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become(s) obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Sky Virtue Holdings Limited (which is wholly owned by Ms. Zhang Yifan) held approximately 56.55% of the issued share capital of the Company (excluding any treasury Shares). In the event that the Directors exercise the Repurchase Mandate in full and assuming that the current shareholdings of the substantial shareholders of the Company remain unchanged, the shareholding of Sky Virtue Holdings Limited would increase to approximately 62.83% of the then issued share capital of the Company. Such increase is not expected to give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any other consequences that may arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases made under the Repurchase Mandate.

In the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full and assuming that the current shareholdings of the substantial shareholders of the Company remain unchanged, the percentage of Shares held by the public would fall below 25% of the then issued share capital of the Company. However, the Directors will not exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would result in the public float of the Company falling below the minimum public float requirement of 25% prescribed under the GEM Listing Rules.

9. SHARES REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

No repurchases of Shares have been made by the Company (whether on the GEM or otherwise) during the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

10. GENERAL

The Company may cancel such repurchased Shares or hold them as treasury Shares, subject to market conditions and the Group's capital management needs at the relevant time of the repurchases.
